Problem Corner

A Phalaenopsis bloomed for 5 months, then put out another spike. The roots are growing through the bottom of the pot; should the roots be cut when repotting? The roots may be cut off to get the plant out of the pot, but the plant would be healthier if the pot were cut away and the roots left intact.

There are small clear sticky spots on the leaves of a plant – is this is a normal process? This can happen with healthy plants and is formally known as guttation (called "happy sap" by some members).

A four-year-old plant bloomed continuously but had small black bugs on the underside of its leaves. What was this? The insect was identified as scale. Scale can be removed by repeated treatment with a systemic insecticide, or frequent manual removal to ensure all insects are eliminated (which can be laborious if the infestation is large).


