

Announcements

Bob welcomed members and guests to the September meeting.

Plant sale purchasing procedure: Leave your membership number at the front table. When your number is drawn you may choose one plant from the table. There is a free-for-all once all numbers are drawn and if there are

any remaining plants you may choose as many as you like. Ten percent of the sales go to the society for operating costs, the remaining goes to the seller of the plant.

Lori Pozniak coordinates our refreshments for each meeting, phoning members to request a donation. Each month we are provided a marvellous array of snacks. Heather Anderson and Cheryl Adamson met again with Prairieland Park coordinators to plan for the Canadian Orchid Congress to be held in conjunction with Gardenscape 2015. Heather and Cheryl have been invited to sit on the Gardenscape planning committee.

Heather reviewed the 4 art categories to be judged at the COC and asked for SOS members to forward contact information to Yvette for art groups that may be interested in submitting art for judging at the COC. Florists will also be contacted. Please see the SOS website for more information.

Problem Corner

Questions were asked about a mini Dendrobium with 3 keikis - when can they be detached, how can they be planted? The roots should be about 2 inches long (since it is a mini plant; usually Phal keikis are left to grow 6" roots before detaching). It was recommended to place some sphagnum moss around the roots to increase humidity since the roots looked a bit dehydrated. Cut the keikis off the mother plant with a sharp, sterile blade and pot together. It was also suggested that the keikis could be left on the mother plant for a more floriferous display.

A query was made about a Dendrobium with black leaf spots; it was suggested that the spots may be a result of spider mites.

Show and Tell

Twenty five flowering plants were shown by Gabriele Burmeister, Pat Randall, Sherida Gregoire, Cheryl Adamson, Tracey Thue, Cody Hamilton, Bob Lucas, Mary Orchard, Al Hartridge, and Heather Anderson.

SHOW UPDATE by Heather Anderson, COC Show Co-Chair

As mentioned in the September Newsletter each of the seven AOS Judges have been asked to give an educational presentation. Three vendors have also either volunteered or have been asked to do a presentation. The goal is to have one speaker/day on the main stage and 2-3 daily presentations in Hall A with information more specific to orchid growers. Don Keith, Speaker Coordination has been contacting all the potential speakers to inquire about possible topics.

The third of three judges has been confirmed to judge the photography, art and orchids in use categories.

A meeting has been held with Shirley Keith, Volunteer Coordination to determine the areas were volunteers will be needed and the hours that volunteer coverage will be required at Gardenscape. There will be lots of opportunities to volunteer during the 3 day event so once sign-up sheets are circulated please consider putting your name into as many time slots as possible. For every day you volunteer you will receive free admission to Gardenscape. It will be fun to volunteer at an event of this calibre and you will be able to attend a COC without travelling outside of Saskatoon.

A third vendor (international) has confirmed attendance and several of the Judges are also orchid vendors so it is anticipated that they will bring orchids to sell at the COC.



November Meeting: Repotting demonstrations!

Orchids that are beginning active growth, or ones that grow throughout the year can be repotted this time of the year. Plants that are potted in media that has broken down to the point where too much moisture is held at the roots must be repotted any time of the year. Many growers repot newly acquired plants into their own media. This provides an opportunity to check on the condition of the roots so that watering can be adjusted accordingly.

Members of the executive will set up 2 or 3 display tables with plants and materials to demonstrate repotting. You are welcome to come and go from one table to another to observe and ask questions as the potting takes place.

Pictured below are some plants from an order that came bare-root, so needed potting up as soon as possible. It's always exciting!
