

Dave Sorokowsky, Paph Paradise

"Don't Fear the Slippers"

After receiving his degree in biochemistry from the University of Toronto, Dave opted to step outside his chosen field and operated a tropical fish import business for eight years. Upon returning to school, Dave received a degree in enology and viticulture from Brock University in St. Catherines, Ontario. While attending Brock, Dave began acquiring orchids, one 2-inch pot at a time and, before he graduated, Dave had over one hundred orchids. About one year later, winemaking and a passion for orchids prompted Dave to seek a warmer climate in California.

Dave has been growing paphiopedilums for about fifteen years and seriously hybridizing for the past ten years. He is an accredited AOS judge and his paphiopedilums have received over 100 awards to date from the AOS and CSA. Many of those awarded plants play important roles in his breeding program.

In 2018, Dave left winemaking in order to focus all of his time running Paph Paradise Orchids.

SEPTEMBER GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

DATE: September 23, 2023 1:30 p.m. CST **LOCATION:** Elim Church, 419 Slimmon Road

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Vice-President Shayne Feltis welcomed everyone to the meeting. He led today's meeting as President Tracey Thue was unable to attend.
- Thank you to Cheryl Grummett for stepping in as Treasurer for Donna Carlson O'Keefe, who was also away.
- Don Keith reported that the supplies table was clearing out pots, mostly 2" and 3", and selling them at half price. There were also donated clay pots for \$6 each.
- Plant sale table: please enter your member number in a draw with Cheryl Grummett, so that your name can be drawn; you can then go up to choose a plant to purchase.
- We will have a Zoom presentation from Francisco Miranda.
- 50/50 tickets are available to purchase. 1 for \$1.00; 3 for \$2.00 from Cheryl Grummett.

PROBLEM CORNER:

A member expressed her dismay that a vandal did not survive. It had a problem that affected the plant's stem, with leaves that fell off before the problem could be properly addressed.

SHOW AND TELL:

Robert Henderson photographed the plants for the newsletter.

Don Keith

- 1. *Lepanthes telipogoniflora* acquired from Ecuagenera. It is grown in his cool room and kept moist. It had one red flower and 3 buds.
- 2. Pleurothallis rubella acquired two years ago from another member.
- 3. *Masdevallia niesseniae* 2020 from Ecuagenera. It was a large plant when it arrived. It had many yellow to orange flowers and grown in a basket. The OSPF is holding a remote judging event in Edmonton not connected to a show; Don is contemplating taking this plant.

Bob Lucas:

1. *Paphiopedilum charlesworthii* 'BB' - a species with three chocolate, green and strawberry-coloured blossoms. It is grown in Orchiata, watered twice a week and fertilized weekly.

Lynn Campbell:

- 1. *Paphiopedilum* Tinicum (*Paph glaucophyllum* x *Paph concolor*) 2 cream-coloured blooms. It has been in Lynn's collection for many years. It is grown in an east windowsill and watered weekly.
- 2. *Phalaenopsis bellina* ordered from J&L Orchids last year. Came in spike and has been a sequential bloomer since May. It's grown under lights in the winter and watered once or twice/week. It seems to do better with more frequent watering.

Heather Anderson:

- 1. *Bulbophyllum* Elizabeth Ann 'Buckleberry' FCC/AOS Heather keeps it in her orchidarium, which maintains very high humidity.
- 2. *Dendrobium* Aussie's Hi-Lo red yellow; from Ten Shin and grown mounted. It has been blooming all summer, and has done better for Heather than the species *Den. cuthbertsonii*.
- 3. *Pleurothallis rubella* small blooms but it does bloom frequently.

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES, CONT.

Cody Hamilton:

- 1. *Brassocatanthe* Cheryle Daniel (*Brassocattleya* Maikai 'Lea' 4n AM/AOS x *Cattleya* Caudebec 'Linwood' 4n AM/AOS) from Sunset Valley Orchids. Cody suspects that this purple-flowered cross is now named Cheryle Daniel. A division of this plant is on the sales table. (Editor's note: confirmed registered name is *Brassocatanthe* Cheryle Daniel.)
- 2. *Cattleya* (Slc.) Angel Eyes x *Cattleya* (Pot.) Virginia Dickey also acquired from SVO. As Cody was hoping for a flower with flared petals. this pretty little flower is going on the sales table. (Editor's note: registered name is *Cattleya* Virginia's Eyes.)

Merle Ward:

1. *Rhyncholaeliocattleya* Village Chief Rose 'Gangshan King' (*Rlc*. Taiwan Queen x *Rlc*. Chunyeah) - this was grown outside in the shade all summer and rewarded Merle with a striking yellow flower with burgundy-edged petals.

PRESENTATION:

Due to technical difficulties, we were unable to show the presentation via the TV or projector, so it was viewed via the laptop screen.

Francisco Miranda presented to us Part 1 of a three-part series - Brazilian Orchid Habitats: the Amazon. Francisco is a taxonomist, naturalist and orchid grower. He travels extensively in the U.S. and internationally, speaking at orchid-related events and meetings. He has been doing this since 1988 while still living in Brazil. The subjects of these presentations reflect Francisco's extensive travels to study orchids in their natural environments. Miranda Orchids is located between Orlando and Tampa, Florida.

Francisco discussed and showed many photos of different species of orchids growing in their natural habitats, found in the low-lands of Brazil. He spoke of the various types of low-land habitats, including dry land forests, *campina* (open forest), *igapo* (seasonally flooded forests), and *varzeas* (flood plains). He explained the geography and function of the forests with cycles of tree growth, nutrients, and water over the changing seasons. Temperatures do not vary much in the equatorial regions, but are warmer at lower elevations. There was a wide range of orchids in the different microclimates, from higher in the trees to down near the tree roots.

Francisco was able to bring to us his personal experiences in these tropical areas, stories about rainy nights spent sleeping in the jungle and contending with the wildlife and insects.

PLANT SALE:

Thank you to Sharon Klein who gifted many *Maxillaria tenuifolia* and two cattleya hybrids that came from the collection of Mercedes Montgomery, a past member. These plants were all marked as \$2 on the sales table for the benefit of both members and the SOS. In all, there were about three dozen plants, including many cattleya hybrids, jewel orchids, vanilla, and the *Maxillaria tenuifolia*. All were sold.

50/50 DRAW: Total sales were \$70. \$35 went to the winner, Heather Anderson.

ADJOURNMENT: Meeting was adjourned by Shayne at 3:55 pm. There were 22 members and 2 guests in attendance.


